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# Episode of admitted patient care—diagnosis onset type

## Identifying and definitional attributes

<b>Metadata item type:</b>	Data Element Concept
<b>METEOR identifier:</b>	269657
<b>Registration status:</b>	<a href="#">Health!</a> , Superseded 05/02/2008
<b>Definition:</b>	A qualifier for each coded diagnosis to indicate the onset and/or significance of the diagnosis to the episode of care.
<b>Context:</b>	Health services

## Object Class attributes

### Identifying and definitional attributes

<b>Object class:</b>	<a href="#">Episode of admitted patient care</a>
<b>Definition:</b>	The period of admitted patient care between a formal or statistical <a href="#">admission</a> and a formal or statistical <a href="#">separation</a> , characterised by only one care type.
<b>Context:</b>	Admitted patient care.
<b>Specialisation of:</b>	<a href="#">Service episode</a>

### Collection and usage attributes

<b>Guide for use:</b>	This treatment and/or care provided to a patient during an episode of care can occur in hospital and/or in the person's home (for <a href="#">hospital-in-the-home</a> patients).
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### Source and reference attributes

<b>Origin:</b>	Health Data Standards Committee.
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## Property attributes

### Identifying and definitional attributes

<b>Property:</b>	<a href="#">Diagnosis onset type</a>
<b>Definition:</b>	An indicator of whether a diagnosed condition was present prior to the start of care.
<b>Property group:</b>	<a href="#">Service provision event</a>
