## Collection and usage attributes

**Guide for use:** Expenses relating to purchases of goods and services are to be reported in millions to the nearest 100,000 e.g. \$4,064,000 should be reported as \$4.1 million.

When revenue from transactions are offset against expenses from transactions, the result equates to the net operating balance in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards Board 1049 (September 2006).

Includes:

- administrative expenses (excluding workers compensation premiums and payouts)
- domestic services
- drug supplies
- food supplies
- grants
- medical and surgical supplies
- patient transport
- payments to visiting medical officers
- repairs and maintenance
- social benefits
- subsidy expenses
- other expenses (includes contracted care services purchased from private hospitals)

**Collection methods:** Data are collected and nationally collated for the reporting period - the financial year ending 30th June each year.

In accounting terms, expenses are consumptions or losses of future economic benefits in the form of reductions in assets or increases in liabilities of the entity (other than those relating to distributions to owners) that result in a decrease in equity or net worth during the reporting period.

Expenses relating to purchases of goods and services are to be reported for the *Health industry relevant organisation type* and *Type of health and health related functions* data elements.

*Health industry relevant organisation type*

State and territory health authorities are **NOT** to report the following codes:

Codes 106–109; 111; 115–119; 123; 201 and 203

*Type of health and health related functions*

State and territory health authorities are **NOT** to report the following codes:

Codes 199; 299; 303–305; 307; 499; 503–504; 599; 601–603; 688; 699
