Object class:	Episode of admitted patient care
Definition:	The period of admitted patient care between a formal or statistical admission and a formal or statistical separation , characterised by only one care type.
Context:	Admitted patient care.
Specialisation of:	Service episode

Collection and usage attributes

Guide for use:	This treatment and/or care provided to a patient during an episode of care can occur in hospital and/or in the person's home (for hospital-in-the-home patients).
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Source and reference attributes

Origin:	Health Data Standards Committee.

Identifying and definitional attributes

Property:	Palliative care phase
Definition:	A distinct clinical period which reflects the stage of an individual's illness.
Context:	Palliative care phase provides a good indication of the type of care required by an individual receiving palliative care.
Property group:	Physical wellbeing
