### Collection and usage attributes

This includes any <a href="#">adverse events</a> taking place within a specified period after treatment.</p> <p>If this item indicates the presence of a treatment complication, items outlining the complication date, the complication type and the outcome of the complication should also be completed.</p>
Collection methods:	Collect from patient medical records.
