This includes carer households authorised to provide:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Foster care (including provisionally approved carers)</li><li>• Relative/kinship care (including provisionally approved carers)</li><li>• Respite</li><li>• Long-term guardianship.</li></ul>

## Collection and usage attributes

<b>Guide for use:</b>	Residential care and family group homes are not included in the scope of carers in the Carer household authorisation file.
<b>Collection methods:</b>	Each change in Carer household authorisation/registration status will be a new line in the file, delineated by an authorisation start and end date. Renewal of an existing authorisation as part of a standard ongoing review process or a change from provisional to full authorisation are not deemed to be a change in authorisation status and should not be recorded on a new line. The original authorisation start date should be retained.
