measures the motor function of a patient for four activities of daily living.

Comments: RUG-ADL is a four-item scale measuring patient motor function for activities of

daily living including:

Bed mobility

Toileting

TransfersEating

The scoring scale for bed mobility, toileting and transfers is:

1 - Independent or supervision only

3 - Limited physical assistance

4 - Other than two person physical assist

5 - Two or more person physical assist

Note: A score of 2 is not valid for bed mobility, toileting and transfer items.

The scoring scale for eating is:

1 - Independent or supervision only

2 - Limited assistance

3 - Extensive assistance/total dependence/tube fed

The total RUG-ADL score (the sum of the individual scale items) will be a value

between 4 and 18.
