	A surgical procedure in which a tiny incision is created in the eardrum to relieve pressure caused by excessive build-up of fluid, or to drain pus from the middle ear.
	CODE 3 Adenoidectomy
	The surgical removal of the adenoids for reasons which include impaired breathing through the nose, chronic infections, or recurrent earaches.
