<b>Guide for use:</b>	<p>The suburb/town/locality name may be a town, city, suburb or commonly used location name such as a large agricultural property or Aboriginal community.</p> <p>This metadata item may be used to describe the location of an organisation or person. It can be a component of a street or postal address.</p> <p>This data element is one of a number of items that can be used to create a primary address, as recommended by the AS 4590-2006 <i>Interchange of client information</i> standard. Components of the primary address are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Address site (or Primary complex) name</li><li>• Address number or number range</li><li>• Road name (name/type/suffix)</li><li>• Locality</li><li>• State/Territory</li><li>• Postcode (optional)</li><li>• Country (if applicable).</li></ul>
<b>Collection methods:</b>	Patient mail address suburb is only relevant if it is different to the residential address suburb. It is only recorded in the NAPAAWL DC if the patient agrees to provide it.
<b>Comments:</b>	Official locality names and their associated boundary extents are assigned by relevant state naming committees/protocols. Their correct usage is encouraged.
