Computation description: Rates directly age-standardised to the 2001 Australian population.

Age group is calculated from age at first service event during the reference period, or as at 1 July of the reference period where a service event (hospital admission or residential episode) commenced prior to 1 July.

Remoteness is derived from Statistical Area 2 (SA2) (or postcode where SA2 is not available) of the client at first service event, consistent with derived age, and is proportionally allocated using a population-based concordance.

Socio-Economic Indexes for Areas (SEIFA) is derived from SA2 (or postcode where SA2 is not available) of the client at first service event and is proportionally allocated using a population-based concordance.

For remoteness and SEIFA, if a null result is returned from the first event, the next valid result is to be used.

MBS and DVA item numbers change over time. Extracted data may include historical item numbers that are no longer current but have been processed by Medicare Australia within the reference period.

There is likely to be considerable overlap between the MBS/DVA data and the private hospital data, as most patients accessing private hospital services would access MBS items in association with the private hospital service.

Indigenous information is not currently available for private psychiatric hospital or DVA data.

AlHW has been undertaking scoping work to reduce the known over count in the number of people, as people could be receiving services from more than one service type. The scoping work used a statistical linkage key to conduct data linkage to determine a non-duplicated person count. Data using this methodology may be available for this cycle.

For 2011–12 data, the 2011 SEIFA IRSD quintile and decile data were produced using the Australian Geography Classification geographical unit of Statistical Local Area. For 2012–13 data, the 2011 SEIFA IRSD quintile and decile data will be produced using the Australian Statistical Geography Standard geographical unit of Statistical Area 2.
