This excludes transfers to discharge/transit lounges or transfers to <a href="#">hospital-in-the-home</a> .  CODE 8 Other  To be recorded for a patient who has not been transferred from an emergency department short stay unit to another admitted patient ward in the same hospital. This includes transfers to discharge/transit lounges or transfers to hospital-in-the-home.  Where a patient has been assigned Code 8, their <a href="#">Mode of separation</a> should be used to determine their departure destination from an emergency department short stay unit.
