CODE 1 Harm reduction

Harm reduction aims to reduce harm to the individual rather than reducing their substance use. This includes education about safe substance use practices.

CODE 2 Controlled drinking

Controlled drinking aims to help the individual monitor their drinking and keep their alcohol consumption within safe levels.

CODE 3 Controlled use of other substances

Controlled use of other substances aims to help the individual monitor their substance use and keep their consumption within safe levels.

CODE 4 Abstinence

Abstinence aims to help the individual to completely stop using drugs/alcohol.

CODE 5 Cultural support/involvement

Includes bush camps, traditional healing/arts/crafts, and mentor programs involving Elders.
