## Collection and usage attributes

<b>Computation description:</b>	For the numerator and denominator 'newly presenting' means that the patient presented with heavy menstrual bleeding as a new problem.  For the numerator, 'first visit' means the visit at which the patient newly presented with heavy menstrual bleeding. The 'second visit' is the visit following the first visit.  Presented as a percentage.
<b>Computation:</b>	$(\text{Numerator} \div \text{Denominator}) \times 100$
<b>Numerator:</b>	The number of patients newly presenting with heavy menstrual bleeding who have a serum ferritin test and a full blood count at their first or second visit.
<b>Denominator:</b>	The number of patients newly presenting with heavy menstrual bleeding.
