## Collection and usage attributes

<b>Population group age from:</b>	50 years or older
<b>Computation description:</b>	For the patient to be counted in the numerator, at least one adenoma must be histologically confirmed.  Both the numerator and denominator only include patients with an intact colon. Both the numerator and denominator exclude patients with a finding of acute <a href="#">inflammatory bowel disease</a> .  Presented as a percentage.
<b>Computation:</b>	$(\text{Numerator} \div \text{Denominator}) \times 100$
<b>Numerator:</b>	The number of patients undergoing a colonoscopy with at least one adenoma detected.
<b>Denominator:</b>	The number of patients undergoing a colonoscopy.
