<b>Scope:</b>	The Prison clinic contact National best endeavours data set (NBEDS) defines visits by prisoners to the prison clinic during the National Prisoner Health Data Collection period.

## Collection and usage attributes

<b>Statistical unit:</b>	The two statistical units in this data set are the <a href="#">Health service event</a> and the <a href="#">Person</a> .  In the Prison clinic contact NBEDS person refers to the prisoner attending the prison clinic.
<b>Guide for use:</b>	The Prison clinic contact NBEDS is a component of the Prisoner health NBEDS. The Prisoner health NBEDS defines data about public and private prisons operating in Australia. It includes data on prison entrants, prison dischargees, prisoners who visit a prison clinic or take prescribed medication while in custody, prison clinic services and prison clinic staffing levels.  In this NBEDS, a 'visit' is defined as a face-to-face consultation for which an entry is made in the health service record (other than for routine household-type treatments such as band-aids or paracetamol).
<b>Collection methods:</b>	Information on clinic visits is provided by the treating health professional at the clinic using the Prisoners in Custody—Clinic form. One form is to be completed for each clinic contact.

	<p>CODE 2 Psychologist</p> <p>Psychologists investigate, assess and provide treatment and counselling to foster optimal personal, social, educational and occupational adjustment and development. This permissible value maps to unit group 2723 (Psychologists) of the ANZSCO classification scheme.</p>	
	<p>CODE 3 Psychiatrist</p> <p>Psychiatrists diagnose, assess, treat and prevent human mental, emotional and behavioural disorders. Registration or licensing is required. This permissible value maps to occupation 253411 (Psychiatrist) of the ANZSCO classification scheme.</p>	
	<p>CODE 4 Nurse</p> <p>A registered nurse provides nursing care to patients in hospitals, aged care and other health care facilities, and in the community. This permissible value maps to unit group 2544 (Registered Nurses) of the ANZSCO classification scheme. Mental health nurses are excluded from this code.</p> <p>An enrolled nurse provides nursing care to patients in a variety of health, aged care, welfare and community settings under the supervision of Registered Nurses. Registration or licensing is required. This permissible value maps to occupation 411411 (Enrolled nurse) of the ANZSCO classification scheme.</p>	
	<p>CODE 5 Aboriginal health worker</p> <p>Aboriginal health workers liaise with patients, clients, visitors to hospitals and other medical facilities and staff at health clinics, and works as a team member to arrange, coordinate and provide health care delivery in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community health clinics. Registration or licensing may be required. This permissible value maps to unit group 411511 (Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Worker) of the ANZSCO classification scheme.</p>	
	<p>CODE 6 Alcohol and drug worker</p> <p>An Alcohol and drug worker provides support and treatment for people with drug and alcohol dependency problems, develops strategies which assist them to set goals and affect and maintain change, and provides community education. This permissible value maps to occupation 272112 (Drug and Alcohol Counsellor) of the ANZSCO classification scheme.</p>	
	<p>CODE 7 Dentist</p> <p>Dentists provide assessment, diagnosis, treatment, management and preventive services to patients of all ages. Registration or licensing is required. This permissible value maps to occupation 252312 (Dentist) of the ANZSCO classification scheme.</p>	
	<p>CODE 8 Social worker/welfare officer</p> <p>Social workers assess the social needs of individuals, families and groups, assists and empower people to develop and use the skills and resources needed to resolve social and other problems, and further human wellbeing and human rights, social justice and social development. Registration or licensing may be required. This permissible value maps to occupation 272511 (Social worker) of the ANZSCO classification scheme.</p> <p>Welfare Workers assist individuals, families and groups with social, emotional or financial difficulties to improve quality of life, by educating and supporting them and working towards change in their social environment. 	<p>Mental health nurses provide nursing care to patients with mental health illness, disorder and dysfunction, and those experiencing emotional difficulties, distress and crisis in health, welfare and aged care facilities, correctional services and the community. Registration or licensing is required. This permissible value maps to occupation 254422 (Registered Nurse - Mental Health) of the ANZSCO classification scheme.</p> <p>CODE 10 Physiotherapist</p> <p>Physiotherapists assess, treat and prevent disorders in human movement caused by injury or disease. Registration or licensing is required. This permissible value maps to occupation 252511 (Physiotherapist) of the ANZSCO classification scheme.</p> <p>CODE 11 Medical imaging professionals</p> <p>Medical imaging professionals provide diagnostic medical services utilising radiant energy techniques such as general radiography, angiography, fluoroscopy, mammography, ultrasound, computed tomography, magnetic resonance imaging, nuclear medicine and bone densitometry. Registration or licensing is required. This permissible value maps to unit group 2512 (Medical imaging professionals) of the ANZSCO classification scheme.</p> <p>CODE 99 Other</p> <p>Other service providers not classifiable into the above categories.</p>
