| <b>Object class:</b>      | <a href="#">Specialised mental health service</a>   |
| <b>Definition:</b>        | Specialised mental health services are those with a primary function to provide treatment, rehabilitation or community health support targeted towards people with a mental disorder or psychiatric disability. These activities are delivered from a service or facility that is readily identifiable as both specialised and serving a mental health care function. |
| <b>Context:</b>           | Hospitals and community mental health establishments and residential mental health establishments.  |
| <b>Specialisation of:</b> | <a href="#">Service/care event</a>  |

| <b>Guide for use:</b>      | <p>The concept of a specialised mental health service is not dependent on the inclusion of the service within the state or territory mental health budget.</p> <p>A service is not defined as a specialised mental health service solely because its clients include people affected by a mental disorder or psychiatric disability.</p> <p>The definition excludes specialist drug and alcohol services and services for people with intellectual disabilities, except where they are established to assist people affected by a mental disorder who also have drug and alcohol related disorders or intellectual disability.</p> <p>These services can be a sub-unit of a hospital even where the hospital is not a specialised mental health establishment itself (e.g. designated psychiatric units and wards, outpatient clinics).</p> |
